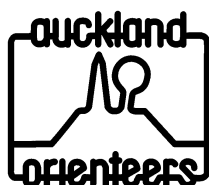

## From the Editor

Please note that the AOA members list you have has a non-functional mobile phone number and email address for me. My current landline telephone number and email address are listed in the editorial bits below.

This edition of the magazine gives the results for the last two OYs, the overall results for the series and reports on the middle and long events in the Auckland Area Championships. It also contains the latest version of the 2008 AOA events calendar.

Constructing the annual AOA events calendar has always been problematic. For the past two years we have had a Winter OY series ending with the AOA championships in mid-September. This has not been a success and I am pleased to see that the 2008 season has been completely rethought in an interesting and innovative way.

The map of AOA orienteering maps on the inside of the back page needs updating – a

volunteer please who has the software and knows what to do.

You will recall the relocation exercise in the last issue if you did it, where you were asked to match the ground to the map to find where you were and hence identify your error. Your mistake was not a parallel but a 180 degree error when exiting the control. You then compounded this by not recognising the track you crossed as being indistinct and then did not STOP and ADMIT something was wrong when you found the climb after the track much easier than you had expected.

The small reentrant you thought the control would be in is 64 mm from the left North line and 13 mm up from the bottom of the map. If you were unable to work out where you were by matching the information given about the terrain to the map then retracing your steps is safer and shorter than going out to the large NW-SE track and trying to relocate off a track intersection or some feature along side the track.

### DEVELOPMENT FUNDING

The NZOF Council recently approved a development grant of \$750 to **Dunedin OC** for the development of a Permanent Orienteering Course at Gabriel's Gully and \$300 to Auckland OC for rogaine development.

Clubs are reminded that "NZOF Development Project Funding Guidelines" are on the NZOF website. Projects referred to in the guidelines include: newer forms of orienteering, permanent courses, orienteering in schools, promotional resources (including web-based resources) and stronger clubs mentoring neighbouring clubs. The primary aim in each case is to increase participation in the sport with a flow-on effect for the recruitment and retention of club members.

## Middle Distance Report - Auckland Championships 2007

### Planner's comments.

Dave Crofts, the long distance event planner identified the great event centre site he wanted to use, and I wanted to try to design a set of courses that could utilize it also and thus minimize set-up and moving of tents, finish etc between the two days.

This made for some challenging course setting as it dictated which parts of the available map I could use, bearing in mind the short lengths generally required for middle distance courses. I wanted to make the most of the fine detail area adjacent to Mushroom Road for short legs and sharp direction changes, and use the vague sloping areas to the south and west for leg length and technical variety.

The first challenge was to identify a suitable start area not too far away from the event centre (I'm not fond of long walks to the start!) that would allow even the shorter courses to get some variety in terrain and leg length and direction. My original idea to start on the south side of Inland Rd was abandoned early on for the eventual start site that allowed the shorter courses to all make use of the Mushroom Rd detail.

Course lengths were difficult to gauge as this area had not had recent events run on it. I thought it was not dissimilar to the Waiuku middle distance map used at Nationals 2007, possibly a bit faster, so I used course lengths and winning/median times from that event as a rough guide when designing my courses.

The challenge for a 10-course event is that some courses have a large number of classes associated with them, and it is not always easy to cater to all classes evenly. However, looking at the winning times for most classes I think it worked out OK.

The rules stipulate 30-35 min winning time for the elites, and no greater than 60% of long distance estimated winning times for red courses (giving 27-49 min range) and median times for orange (30 mins), yellow and white (both 21 min medians). I figured the wording "not greater than" gave me leeway to have winning or median times on the shorter side rather than longer, and this is what eventuated with most times in the range of 25-35 mins.

Another challenge was to find enough good control sites for the start area and in the vague areas heading towards the finish. Some of the sites I thought were more orange than red, but I tried to mitigate the effects of this by having the prior leg to the control require sound orienteering techniques.

Tracks were changing constantly in the weeks preceding the event, and this made finalizing the white and yellow courses particularly difficult, but we got there. A new motorcycle track was made in the area only 2 weeks before, but fortunately it didn't impact on my courses too much.

Both the yellow and white courses came through the top detail area near Mushroom Rd, and this might have confused some white course competitors as there were yellow controls that they passed on their white course - in the future I won't have white and yellow control sites so close together to avoid that situation.

All in all it is a lovely piece of forest and was a nice map to set on, although sharing it with motorcyclists is a bit of a problem. Maybe an ideal map for MTBO, with all the tracks offering good route choices.

### Controller's comments

This event was part one of a two-part Woodhill weekend that most will agree had a variation in terrain and orienteering challenges not often seen in this sand dune O paradise. The Auckland club used this A level event to introduce some "new" blood, Alison and me, as setter and controller, and although there were some stressful moments we are pretty happy with the result.

The main challenges faced were time management (with 2 young children, neither of whom were interested in checking motorbike tracks or control sites in the forest) and changes to the mapped area, with it being actively used by motorcycles.

This will be an ongoing situation, and Selwyn Palmer has to be congratulated for forging new initiatives with the motorcycle clubs, including sharing of map information and GPS tracking of new motorbike routes. Nonetheless we were mapping track changes up until map printing time, and needed to do some track enhancement with a garden rake the day before the event.

The map had so many tracks they were often more of a hindrance to than a help for navigation. They were also a problem for the white course, with track junctions so

close together we often needed to use tape or "sad faces" signs to reduce the density of decision points along the course.

We decided to stagger start times with a one minute start interval and odd and even numbered courses starting on alternate minutes, thus maintaining the required 2 minute gap between competitors. This was a challenge for the helpers at the start, but they managed very well. There were a couple of reports of bunches forming, but also of bunches separating again (including in the elite group), so I believe the high density of start times was not a problem. There were also reports of people running in all directions in the area of high contour detail, which I would like to have witnessed. Rest assured that the general course flow was in one direction with the exception of loops in some courses.

The maps were printed on the Auckland Club's new OKI laser printer, and we were all very happy with the results. Maybe soon we'll be printing maps on demand at the events!

Many thanks to Selwyn for stellar advice and mapping assistance, to Dave for a great event centre, to Ian Sydenham and family for ever-reliable event coordination and to all the volunteers who gave their time to make the event a success.

## Long Distance Report - Auckland Championships 2007

### Planner's comment

Focus on the steep pines bordering the south side of Restall Road and the new flat country toward the coast" they said. Beautiful terrain but sad course shapes and soul-less event centre options abounded.

Saved from mediocrity by the native blocks the next problem was good courses without three map changes between 5 m and 2.5 m to reach the event centre. The creative madness was a bit stifled with only courses 1 - 4 getting to contour morph into the 2.5 m terrain. To preserve the early parts of courses 1 - 3 I felt it was too difficult to include a long leg that was not a road run or needed another map change!

After much wine-fed musing and nocturnal OCAD sessions it was done - thank you Selwyn and Peter! In the end not too much country ended up on both maps.

The legs from the open valleys in the natives up hill to the knolls provided a pleasing range of splits. Apologies to seniors on course 5 and 6 whose times were much longer than expected. My algorithm for considering the effects of age, thinnings and climb was way off. There must be some near exponential relationship model. Some statistical aberrations from M60 showing up their juniors don't count!

I hope you enjoyed the challenge anyway and cussed me good and proper. A highlight was seeing course 9 and 10 finishers after their taped adventures in the dark green. Only their aging chaperones looked fazed.

To be able to include such eclectic terrain on a course and have the support of fresh remapping was a real treat.

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### Controller's comments:

Many thanks to Dave Crofts for interesting and challenging courses. We quickly reached agreement on control sites and courses with minimal changes.

The initial plan had courses climbing ladders over the deer fence during the course. We decided the long walk to the start made better sense, allowing the fence climb before the start.

The natives block at the start for courses 1 to 6 is Hodges Basin, an ecological reserve administered by the Department of Conservation. Woodhill has a healthy population of deer and pigs that destroy regenerating growth. Hence the deer fence project.

The fence is being funded from deer hunting license fees from the hunting zone north of Otakanini Topu. There weren't sufficient funds, so the fence is only half complete.

Great to be able to orienteer in it again before it gets enclosed. We will certainly suggest to DOC that deer proof gates be installed to allow people to continue to enjoy the area. There used to be an excellent signposted walkway through it. When first mapping this area in the early 1980's, I saw a brown frog, presumably a native, as well the bird life.

The second block of natives (courses 1 to 3) on the west side of Restall Road is also an ecological reserve. Again the old walking tracks have been neglected. However Hancock's Forest Management are interested in re-establishing walks through here and have been supplied with our orienteering maps as a base for a new walking track brochure.

While on the subject of reserves, the Woodhill coastal strip of grasses, tussock and scrub is also administered by DOC. But the same zone from Muriwai to just south of Restall Road is an Auckland Regional Council reserve.

Mervyn Paitry did an excellent job of coordinating entries and SportIdent. The whole Sydenham family spent two nights in the forest setting up as well as coordinating the many rostered helpers. Raewyn Bennett has been as reliable as ever with equipment, transport and supplies.

NWOC have a plan for the 5m map next year. AOC plan an OY for the 2.5m map, and look out for the North Island Champs in November 2008.

And the map title? I boringly suggested getting back to "Mushroom Road" and "Restall Road". Dave must have learnt Latin at school, so he devised Latin equivalents, the middle distance name subsequently enhanced by Jeff.

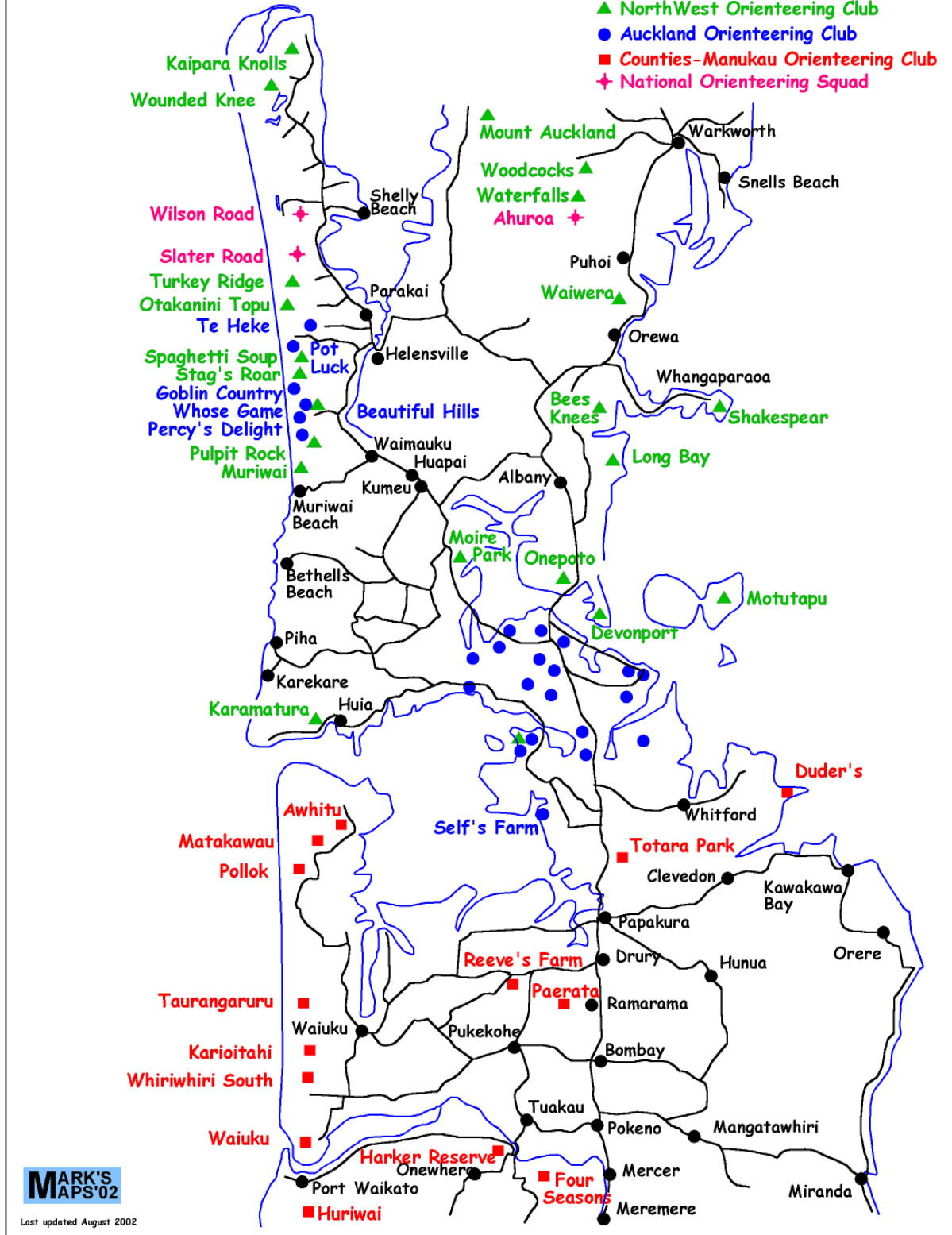
