The final OY results and the announcement of the age class winners follow with the points table for the year as a separate insert. I was unable to include the insert material as pages of this booklet given the respective print and page sizes of the booklet and insert. (The booklet goes to the printer as an MSWord document in Arial 11 point and is turned by a machine into an A5 booklet with a correspondingly reduced font size. The insert was supplied as a MS Worksheet with font size 9). If you can do this using MSWord then I would be very grateful to receive some advice from you.

It has been something of a bizarre OY year as I have experienced it culminating in a somewhat 'Alice in Wonderland' experience of being awarded points for DNFs and having them counted as part of the total for the year. Also, it was a bit irritating on the occasions when I had deliberately not clipped the first control.

Furthermore, the weighting factors did not work for me and I heard nothing but criticism from others. In my age grade, I could get far more OY points running Red 3 rather than Red 4 and "running up" a course became quite widespread. I hope that something better emerges for next year. My preference is for a course – minimum age class structure. For example, M60+ would be in Red 4 and you would have to be age 60 years or older to enter this age class. You could, of course, compete in the M40+ class running Red 2. What's your preference? Let your committee know.

NZ ON THE PODIUM AT WORLD MTBO CHAMPS

Well done to **Marquita Gelderman**, for her 4th and 5th places at WOC MTBO in Poland in the sprint and middle respectively. Altogether NZ had six top 20 placings with Marquita also finishing 11th in the long, Chris Forne 13th (middle) and 19th (long) and Georgia Whitla 15th in the junior middle final.

8th WORLD ROGAINING CHAMPS

Chris Forne at his third world finals in less than two months, teamed up with fellow PAPO member Dennis de Monchy for the biennial rogaining champs, held in Estonia. The pair just failed to retain their world title from 2006, finishing 2nd, 300 points to 304, behind a Russian duo. Another PAPO combination, Tim Farrant & Georgia Whitla won the mixed junior title and were 2nd junior team overall.

VICTORY IN AUSTRALIA

The NZ Schools team has won the Southern Cross Challenge against the Australian state teams at the Australian School Champs for the fifth time in as many years. Top marks to the team and management. The NZ Pinestars, however, lost their away test against the Australian Bushrangers which meant the 2008 series was squared one each.

CLUB KIT: TOOLS TO RUN YOUR CLUB

Club Kit is a free one-stop online resource library found on SPARC's website. The aim is to help clubs succeed and give members more time to enjoy their sport. It contains hundreds of tips, guides, checklists and templates. Eight video clips have now been added to the Club Kit presenting case studies of organisations that have successfully adapted the resources available. They give clubs an easy-to-digest guide to Club Kit: how sports organisations have used the resources to improve how they run their organisations and operate more efficiently and effectively – whether its finance and fundraising, growing membership or increasing awareness in their community. The website www.sportsbuddy.co.nz was launched on 14 June, with the aim of getting people off the couch, increase awareness and grow sports in general throughout the country. Claire Paterson (from North West) checked it out for NZOF and reports: *"It is a pretty cool website. The idea is great, being able to easily find another like-minded person to go walking/running mountain biking within your area. However, I am not sure how orienteering would benefit as you don't usually say "hey, lets go orienteering", and because we are so close-knit and small anyway, most people know people in their area to contact as it is. It is possible it might be useful as just another tool to showcase that orienteering exists, list events and clubs, and perhaps some elites could offer their coaching services or something ..."*

So, even if you just want your club to be seen in your community, check it out and consider registering (no charge).

General Information

Forest car access: car access to some events in a forest in the Auckland region is conditional upon you signing a form on entry into the forest that you have third party insurance on the car you are driving so that the forestry company is insured through you for any damage you cause like setting the forest on fire when you crash into a tree while you were trying to avoid a very large pot hole.

You are not allowed to go for a tour through the forest so please follow the O signs to and from the event centre. One good reason for this is the presence of tree felling and forestry trucks in other parts of the forest.

Gates: Leave these as you find them. Climb over them at the hinged end.

Horses: you are likely to meet people on horse back on some forest tracks and roads. They are easily spooked if they can hear you but not see you, particularly if you are running fast and making a lot of noise. The rider will be appreciative if you step off a track and let the horses through or, if you are running towards horses which are on a track, angle your run to go well in front of the horses. The rider will stop and let you pass in front when you are seen.

Mountain bikes and motor bikes: get off the track if you hear one.

Signposting: the turn off from a main road to an event is signposted with distinctive signs with the word "orienteering" or the letter "O". Different clubs have different signs. In some cases, a warning sign will be given prior to the turn off. Changes in direction on farm/forest roads are also signposted, usually!
