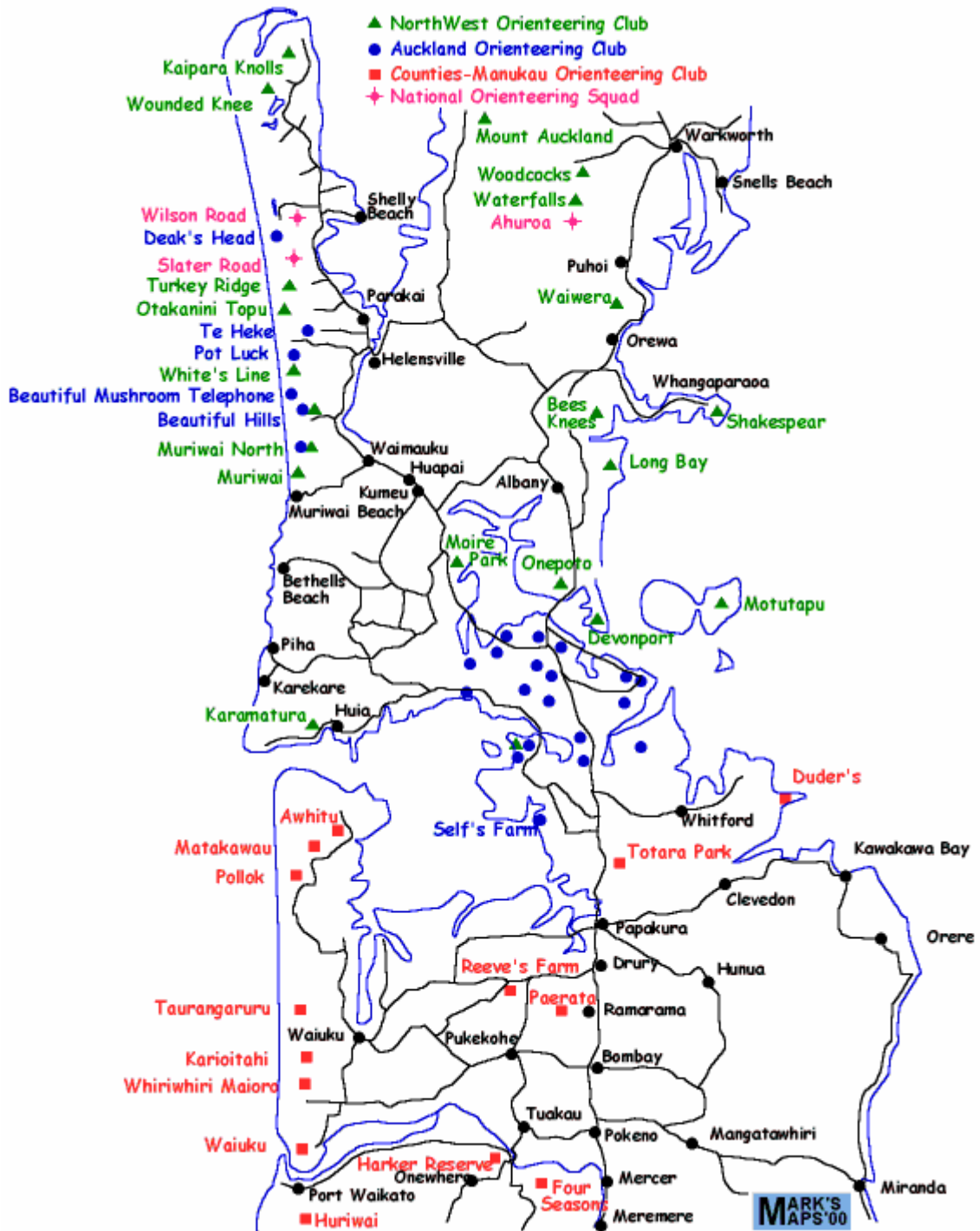

Training Tips

Far From the Milling Crowd

If you get to the vicinity of the control site and find a heap of competent orienteers milling about, you are in the wrong place. If this were the right place, even if the control is hidden, they would already have found it!

The most likely explanation is a parallel error. Look at your map for a nearby similar-but-different feature; assume you are there, and set off for the right one pronto.

Just possibly the parallel error was on the part of the mapper or the setter, in which case you need to do the exact opposite. Sorry about that!

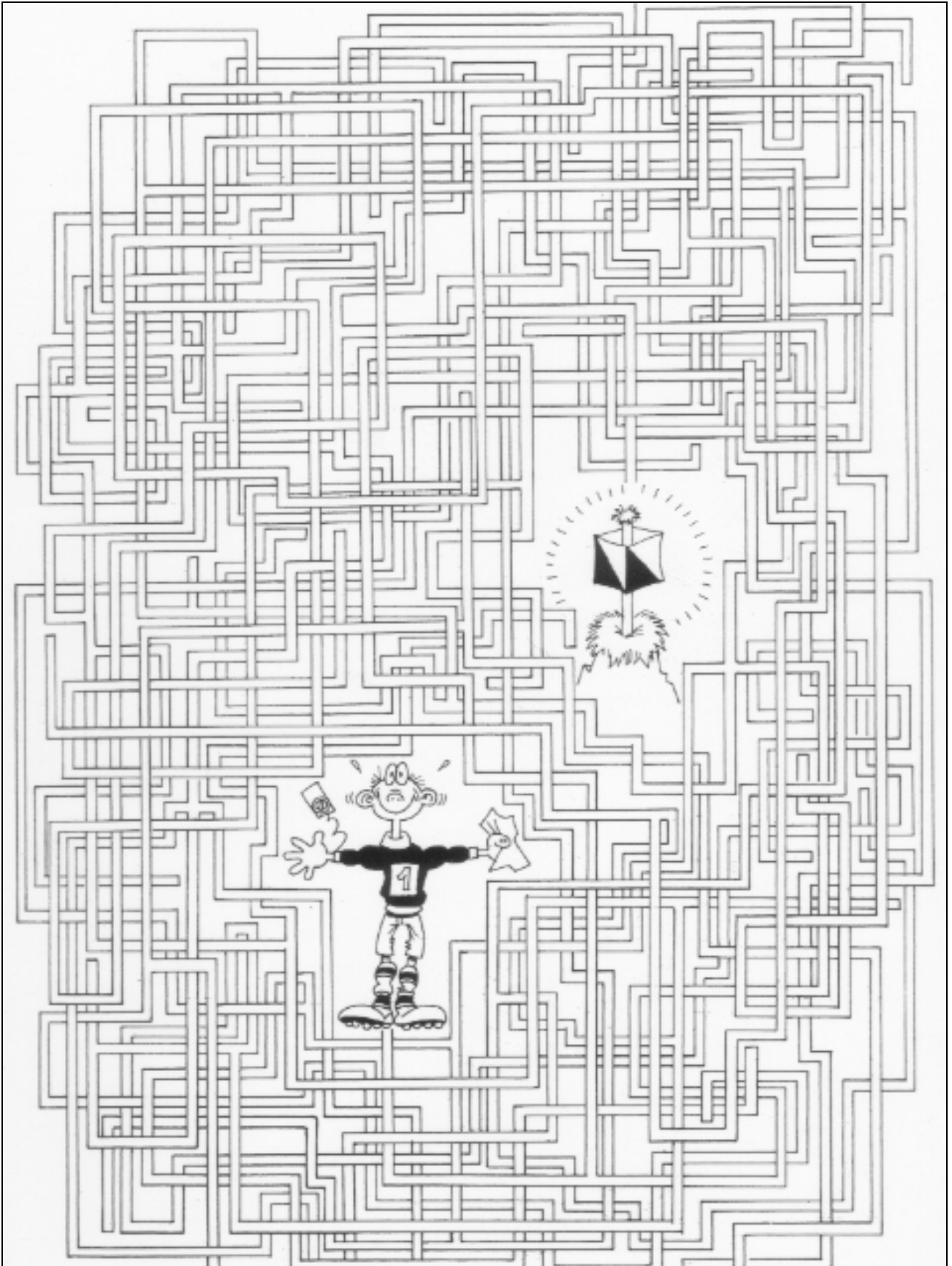

Medical Notes

Well it's been really nice to know that people have been interested in how me old left leg is holding up! Thanks a lot for all your support and here is a really brief run down and update on the last 6 weeks from hop-along.

Numerous other nick names abound from family, friends & colleagues.

For those who are not aware my OY season ended rather abruptly, half an hour after it started at OY1 Duders Regional Park. The reason: I suffered a spiral fracture of the fibula just above the ankle joint. Or for the non-medics among us, a broken leg! To continue would have been most painful and probably silly so I thought a DNF may be warranted after trying to get up from my fall. How did it happen: I tripped over - not much more than that. Apologies for those who want some gory bits in this story - there's none. Fortunately the break was clean and the weather was kind allowing me to happily (well sort of) sit in a paddock sunning myself after groveling over a fence out of the native! Paul was the first to come across me and kindly went to get help 3km away. Of course the remainder of the day was spent joyously in Ak Hospital!

So being in plaster for most leads to a fairly restrictive lifestyle - initially I was no exception. However, after 2 weeks of nervously hobbling around slipping on wet surfaces it was time to get active! My relative freedom was given to me through a

waterproof cast liner. This allowed me to have showers (baths required seriously tricky manoeuvres more akin to mountaineering) and I extended this to swimming, kayaking, long walks on crutches and biking on the wind trainer at home. Never one to pass up a challenge, on my final day in plaster, I walked home on crutches to Pt Chev from the city clocking about 13min k's!!

Finally after 6 weeks in plaster I was set free and am currently going through some intensive physio at Unisportsmed (I highly recommend this place for anyone with sporting injuries) to get the leg in shape to compete in the Abel Tasman Coastal Classic on 7 Sept (35km of coastal running). My goal is to finish.

Other ambitious goals for the next few weeks - stop eating cream donuts, get round all courses in Aussie, do some multisport races before my sporting career finishes in December with an imminent new arrival due in our family.

Many thanks to Paul Gilkison and Scott Vennell and Peter Murphy who got me out of my predicament at Duders. And finally there's a huge thanks that has to go out to Mary who has probably endured more than I with my constant demands

JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPS

Congratulations to Greg Flynn for his performance at JWOC, at Alicante in Spain. Greg produced a top result finishing 21st in the short-O (from a field of 157).

Lara Prince also made the A-final of the short-O, placing 53rd and repeated the placing in the classic. James Bradshaw was the best of the men in the classic finishing 72nd. Commiserations, however, to Todd Oates who never made the start line, instead ending up in hospital with appendicitis.

Greg, James and David Stewart were 27th out of 53 in the relay. The Australians placed 24th and 29th. Lara, Claire Paterson and Kate Bodger were 22nd out of 42, one place ahead of the Australian B team. Australia A was 15th.

GREG BARBOUR RETAINS WORLD TITLE

Congratulations to Greg Barbour on his victory at the 5th World Rogaining Championships at Lesno, Czech Republic. Greg and David Rowlands (Australia) retained the open men's world title they won at the 4th World Rogaining Champs in New Zealand in January 2000. It completed a busy few weeks for Greg after several world cup races for NZ in June and the World MTBO Champs in France, in early July (see following item).

FIRST WORLD MTBO CHAMPIONSHIPS

New Zealand was represented by a team of one at the first world Mountain-Bike Orienteering Championships in France, 1-7 July. National Squad member, Greg Barbour, finished in the top half of both the classic and short-MTBO races, placing 59th and 51st respectively.
