

## COACHING DIRECTOR

Applications are invited for the position of NZOF Coaching Director. This is a one-year contract appointment, approximately one-day a week, for which the primary role is to identify the needs and priorities of orienteering coaching within New Zealand. A dedicated "coaching" email address is provided.

The position is remunerated and the Coaching Director is responsible for coordinating NZOF's coaching services including the National Squad, Development Squad and the Primary and Secondary School Coordinators.

The applicant should have coaching experience and qualifications but the emphasis is on identifying needs and coordinating services to meet them. The Coaching Director is therefore encouraged to contract in specialised services rather than trying to undertake all coaching delivery themselves.

Position formally starts 1 January 2003 and it is hoped that the appointee will be effectively operating by 1 February.
